COVID-19 (novel coronavirus) update

As a valued Sundale team member, I wanted to provide you with an update and outline Sundale's current approach to managing the COVID-19 situation.

SUNDALE CARE CENTRES - RESTRICTED ACCESS.

In response to the evolving COVID-19 situation in Brisbane, Longreach, Gladstone and Hervey Bay and ongoing vulnerable facility restrictions in South East Queensland, Sundale has made the considered decision to restrict access at its Care Centres until at least Monday, 26 July 2021.

Restrictions at Sundale's Care Centre's include:

- Visitors
 - Will be assessed on a case-by case basis
 - o Only people providing an essential service will be permitted to enter
 - o Sundale will assist visitors with family members in palliative care or for the purpose of end-of-life support

Sundale will review this decision on a daily basis.

CONTACT TRACING ALERTS

Sundale team members are being reminded to check the Queensland Health website prior to any shift for the latest COVID-19 information, including current contact tracing alerts and related public health advice.

Sundale team members who have been to any of the listed exposure venues at the relevant times, must follow the health advice and notify their manager immediately, prior to entering any Sundale facility or building.

The above listed preliminary contact tracing locations in Queensland were announced this morning. Information will be updated, added to and clarified, throughout today on the <u>Queensland Health</u> website.

Sundale will continue to work with Queensland Health and make responsible, considered decisions to help minimise the threat of COVID-19 entering any Sundale facilities.
