## COVID-19 (novel coronavirus) update

As a valued member of the Sundale community, I wanted to provide you with an update and outline Sundale's current approach to managing the COVID-19 situation.

## RESTRICTIONS FASED

The Queensland Government will ease COVID-19 restrictions throughout South East Queensland at 4pm today (8 August 2021).

Mandatory mask-wearing will remain in place for everyone in the 11 LGAs coming out of lockdown.

Residents will be allowed to have up to 10 people in their homes, including those who live there, and in public spaces (including clubhouses).

Weddings and funerals in the south-east will have a maximum of 20 people.

Businesses and venues, including places of worship, retail, dining, gyms, beauty and personal care services, will be allowed to operate with some restrictions.

## **CONTACT TRACING**

Sundale Retirement Community residents are being reminded to check the Queensland Health website daily for the latest COVID-19 information, including current contact tracing alerts and related public health advice.

Sundale Retirement Community residents who have been to any of the listed exposure venues at the relevant times, must follow the heath advice and contact Sundale Retirement Villages Manager, Leigh Kersnovske (0448 560 331 or <a href="leigh.kersnovske@sundale.org.au">leigh.kersnovske@sundale.org.au</a>) immediately.

## CLUBHOUSES / HUBS

Sundale's Clubhouses and Hubs will reopen tomorrow at 9am (9 August 2021).

Any persons entering a Sundale Clubhouse / Hub MUST comply with the following Conditions of Entry.

- Be willing to undergo a screening process (including temperatures / previous travel);
- Maintain social distancing;
- Stay at least 1.5 metres away from others;
- Make sure there is at least 4m<sup>2</sup> per person when indoors;
- Wear a mask;
- Practise hand hygiene;
- Practise respiratory hygiene.

Sundale residents and visitors are not permitted to enter a Sundale Clubhouse / Hub if they answer **yes** to any of the screening questions or if their temperature is more than 37.5 degrees.

In accordance with the Queensland Government's 4m<sup>2</sup> per person when indoors directive, each clubhouse has limits that apply.

To help protect the health and wellbeing of all residents and to minimise the threat of COVID-19 entering a Sundale Retirement Community, it is essential residents and visitors thoroughly clean and disinfect all surfaces at the conclusion of all gatherings in a Sundale Clubhouse / Hub.

To help protect the health and wellbeing of all residents, Sundale team members will monitor Clubhouse / Hub activities to ensure the restrictions put in place by the Queensland Government are being met.

Sundale will continue to work with Queensland Health and make responsible, considered decisions to help minimise the threat of COVID-19 entering any Sundale facilities.
